Board of Regents Review

SF 560 requires the Board of Regents to conduct a comprehensive DEI review and report its findings and recommendations during its November 2023 meeting.

This is an opportunity to address misperceptions and illustrate the remarkable work done on our campus to support the success of our students, faculty, and staff.

We appreciate and value the work everyone does in shaping our campus culture and appreciate the Board's guidance on the best path forward.



Framework for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

- Learning how to listen, understand, and communicate with others who do not share a similar background is a skill that must be acquired.
- Cultural competency is a skill, developed over time, through opportunities to engage with individuals and ideas that differ from your life experience.
- DEI is a broad definition that includes individuals with disabilities, veterans, members of the LGBTQ community, students from rural areas, or who are the first in their family to attend college.

Academic Policies and Practices Task Force

- Aligned course drop date with withdraw date to provide students additional time to remain in courses
- Expanded early registration to provide students and advisors additional time to plan for future coursework
- Changed criteria for priority registration to benefit students with an educational need versus a privilege
- Increased the limit for U-Bill holds to allow more students to register
- Currently reviewing policies regarding graduation with distinction, probation, and appeals with goal of having consistent, transparent policies across the undergraduate colleges



Hawkeye Work Grant – Pilot AY 2023

- Partnership between Office of the Provost (which provided funding for the pilot), University Housing and Dining, Student Financial Aid, and University College
- <u>Goal</u>: increase student engagement and retention while also increasing the number of campus work-study funded employees in University Housing and Dining (UHD)
- <u>Target population</u>: First-year students who were eligible for work study
- Students received up to \$1,000 in grant funds in addition to income earned through working
- Utilized Iowa GROW[®] Model (mentored student employment)



Hawkeye Work Grant – Outcomes

- 106 student participated in the pilot
 - 38% identified as first-gen; 29% were underrepresented minorities
- Outcome data comparing the HWG participants to those offered but not participating

AY 2024

- Doubled funding to support up to 250 students (University Housing and Dining, Office of the Provost, University College)
- High interest: 272 students signed up to potentially participate
- Students will again work in UHD, which utilizes lowa GROW®
- Participating students will be able to earn \$3,500 in work-study and receive up to \$1,000 in grant funds (3 disbursements)



University College and Office of the Provost Moves

- ROTC moved from South Quad to Iowa Bioscience Innovation Facility (IBIF)
- Distance and Online Education (DOE) moved to lower level and first floor of Calvin Hall
- Academic Support and Retention moved to the first floor of Calvin Hall
- Registrar moved to 2nd floor Old Capitol Mall



Center for Teaching

- Administrative home transitioned back to the Office of the Provost
- Aligns with peer institution structures and reinforces the value that university leadership places on teaching and learning, while fostering closer connections to the colleges
- Continues to work closely with Office of Teaching, Learning, and Technology and Distance and Online Education
- Remain in the same location: 2090 University Capitol Center



Office of the Registrar Updates

- Supporting CLAS and EDUC undergraduate students by updating curriculum tools to support world language pathways.
- Working with collegiate and campus partners on the Expected Completion Session as well as migrating section, hours, and grade options to MyUI.
- New classroom website redesign (https://classrooms.uiowa.edu/)
- Renovation of 40 & 140 SH is complete which improves student sightlines and updates the learning environment to a more flexible environment.









Why does lowa GROW matter?

« Students who work in Student Life are retained from first to second year at an average of 93% since 2012 versus 86% for the all-student average retention rate.


