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




Who are Transfer Students?

Kirkwood Community College Transfer Students

- 3.21 entering cumulative GPA
- 2.97 first UI term GPA
- 55.1% of Kirkwood students come in with associate's degrees
 - 38.0% A.A.
 - 7.1% A.S.
 - 9.7% A.A.S.

Kirkwood Community College Transfer Students – 2024 Cohort Demographics

- 296 students
- 37.3% first-generation students
- 19.5% students of color
- 30.7% identify as low SES
- 24.1% identify as LGBQ+
- **51.0**% male, **48.6**% female
- 74.3% work an off-campus job
- 52.0% entering with associate's degree

- Starting over in a new setting


