- The Student Success Team is sponsored by the Division of Student Life and the Office of the Provost and is coordinated by an executive committee that includes representatives from each area.












Strategic Plan - Student Retention

- Emergency or "gap" funding for students
- → One process, multiple funds
- → Approximately \$1M in needbased aid annually

Expected Probability of Four-Year Graduation







CAMPUS JOBS ARE A RETENTION TOOL

High-Impact Practices: Don't leave learning on the table

- Bringing highimpact, relationshiprich practices to scale is difficult.
- Infuse meaningful conditions of learning into existing activities rather than adding to an endless list





Mentored student employment is beneficial for <u>all</u> students, but particularly URM & First Gen.



Strategic Plan - Hawkeye Work Grant

- Collaboration with University College
- →Identify students with unmet financial need
- →Offered campus employment within University Housing & Dining
- → Provided Iowa GROW (Guided Reflection on Work) mentored employment experience
- →Earn hourly wage plus \$750-\$1,000 grant

	UI GPA spring 2024	Enrolled fall 2024
Participated in the program (N=117*)	3.19	91%
Did not participate in the program (N=951)	3.11	84%

^{*}For purposes of this research, data was captured on the 117 students employed at the end of spring 2024.



Civic Dialogue


"Better Conversations" Residence Hall Pilot, Year 2

- → Entire residence hall with control (Rienow and Slater)
- → Trained RAs who incorporate principles into daily work with residents, host informal opportunities for real talk
 - → Year 1 findings Treatment Group
- → Stronger sense of belonging and higher self efficacy
- → RA confidence
- → Fewer room changes

"I love this floor. From what I know about other floors, none of the other floors interact like we do. I think we have done a good job of creating a community."




















→ Note Depot


- Developed by AIS Enterprise Student Systems with campus partners
