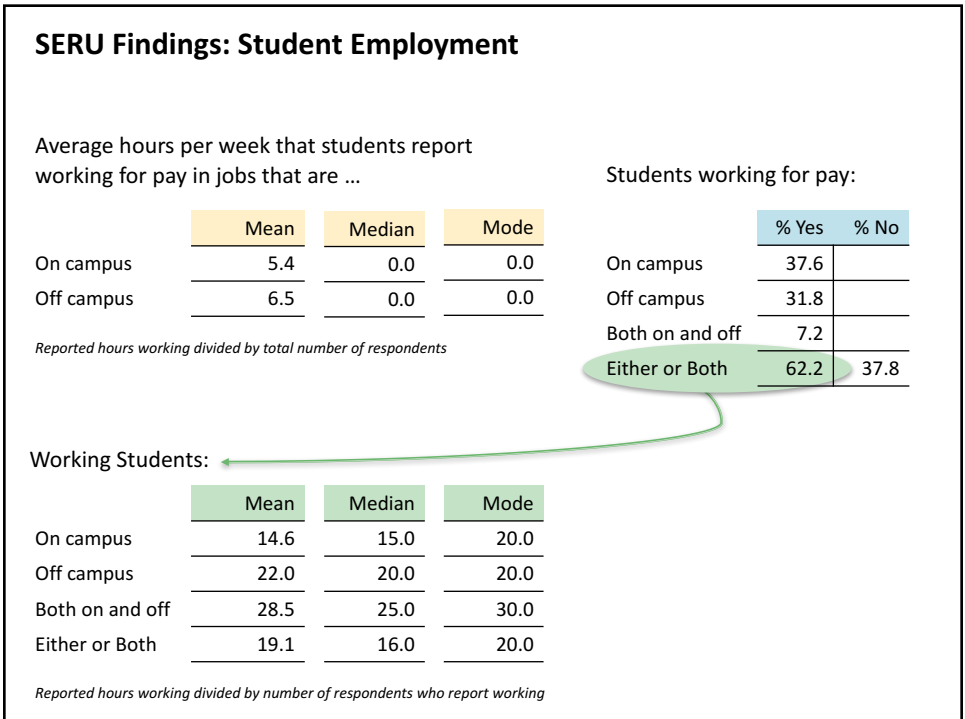
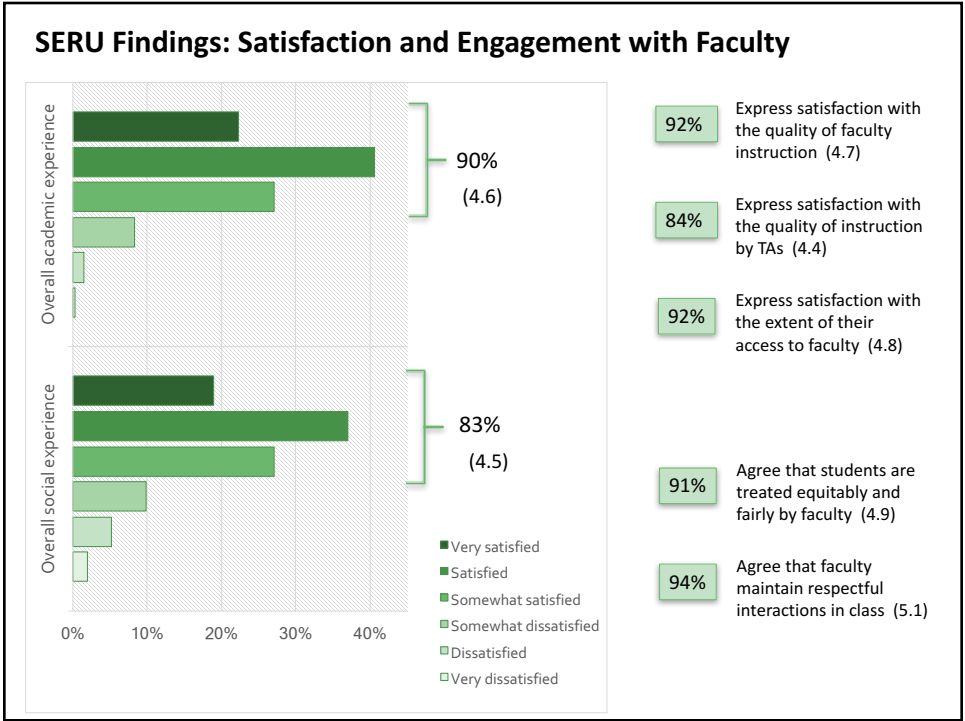

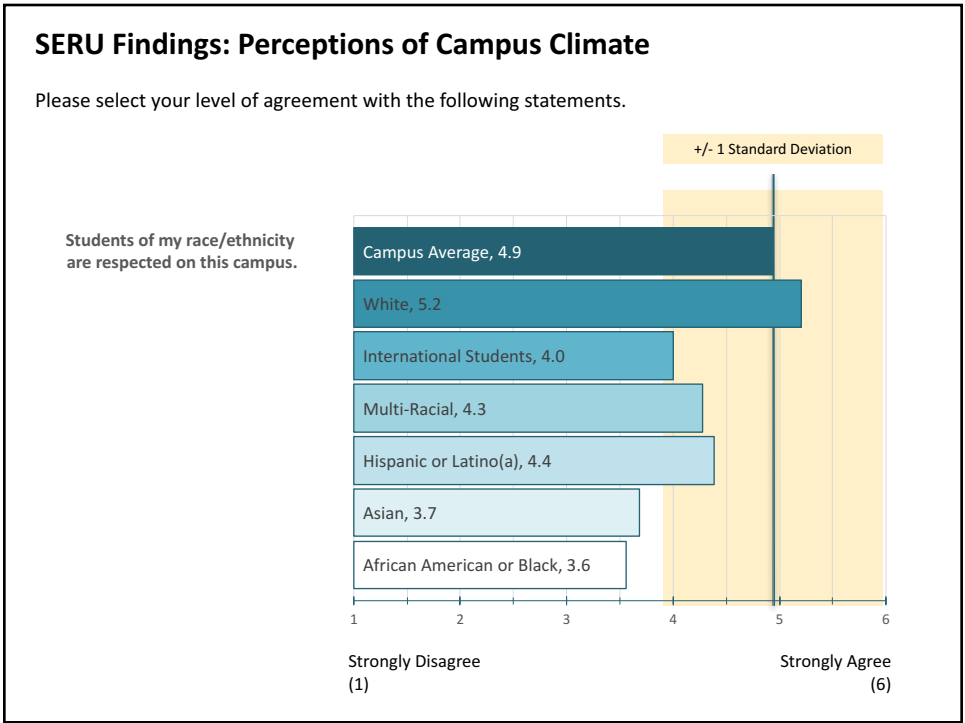

... learning to think critically by incorporating all other class reading materials from other classes ... As I study several subjects and read political, philosophical, and health issues I get to form an idea that all these go together

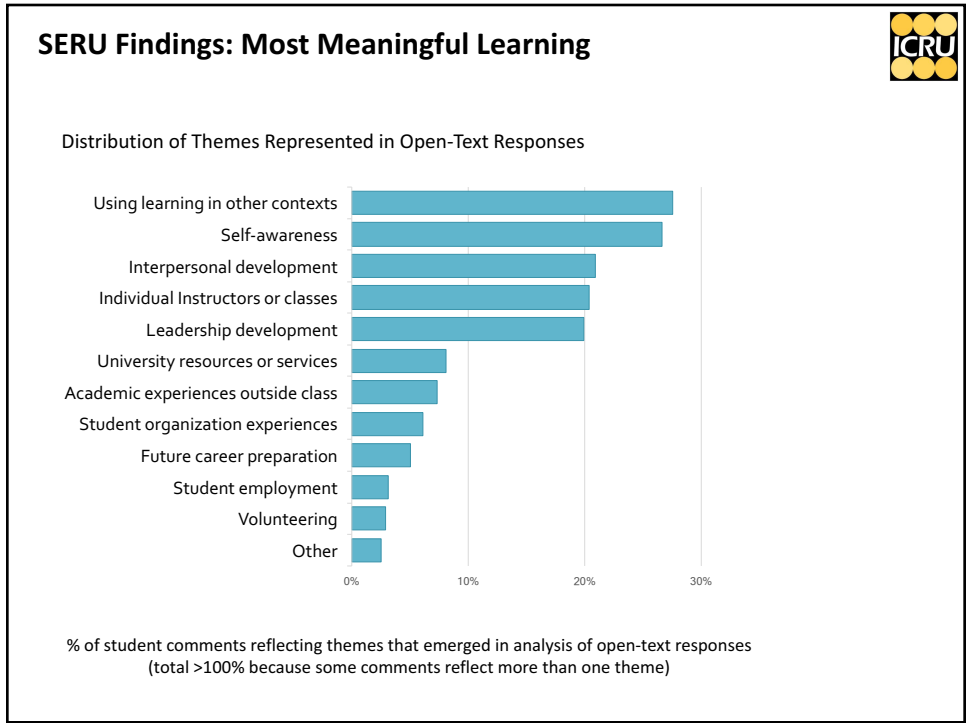
... my study abroad experience in India


